

"And you did not receive the "spirit of religious duty," leading you back into the fear of never being good enough. As beloved children, may we be aware of our Father's delight in us and may we be filled with the same love and affection for Him. May Jesus be the focus of our love and may our eyes remain fixed on Him. May all our doing come out of a place of loving and knowing we are loved.

Do you serve as an overflow of love for Him, or to try earn some favour, or as a religious duty?
