As a shepherd, He provides for us, guides us, feeds us, brings us into rest, restores our lives, leads us into a holy life, protects us from dangers, comforts us, and pours His goodness, favour and mercy on us. All this can be our reality if we come to Him as our shepherd.

Put your trust in Jesus as your shepherd today. He will lead you through the difficult situations you may be going through. He will guide you in the decisions you need to make. He will restore your soul. Come to Him.

He's the eternal good shepherd, who can be trusted. No one can snatch us out of His hand. He's also our heavenly Bridegroom who is passionately in love with us and He gave His life for us.

Let Him hear your voice and see your face as you spend time with Him and walk with Him today. (Song of Solomon 2:14)

You can rest safe and secure in Him.
