



Jesus answered him, I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, that unless a person is born again (anew, from above), he cannot ever see (know, be acquainted with, and experience) the kingdom of God. John 3:3 AMPC

Nicodemus was a respected religious leader; he was a good man. He even recognised that there was something special about Jesus. He acknowledged that He was "a teacher come from God" because of the miracles He was performing, and that God was "with" Him.

Jesus interrupted his discourse with the answer to his unasked question, and said that a person must be born again in order to see or experience the kingdom of God. See John 1:12-13, where John explains that we must <u>receive Jesus</u> to become children of God, to **be "born of God."** There is only one way to the Father and that is through Jesus. (John 14:6).

Nicodemus needed to know that Jesus was not only a teacher, but God the Son, the Saviour, the Messiah and that "whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." (See John 3:14-18)

I grew up Catholic. I went to church, believed that there was a God, even believed in Jesus; that is, I believed that He existed and was the Son of God. However, I knew I wasn't born again. I had not surrendered to His Lordship and "received Him." This very Scripture convinced me thereof, until one day I surrendered to Jesus.

To be born again is something God does in us when we respond to Him in faith and receive Him as our Saviour. It is a supernatural experience where God imparts His life into us and makes us brand new *on the inside*, in our spirit being. We then enter His kingdom and His family, as His child, and learn to know and follow Him. Eternal life is about having a relationship with God. (See John 17:3)
